The first phase of the redevelopment was a 600 space multi-storey car park. Caunton designed, manufactured and erected 750 tonnes of beam and column frameworks, whilst also fixing the precast floor units and the concrete staircases. In addition, Caunton supplied the steelwork for a retail unit - with an area of 24,000sq.ft - which was constructed alongside the car park.
