Caunton have supplied and erected the steelwork for a new school in the Potteries. The new and larger, Thistley Hough High School, designed by architect Aeda, engineer Cundall, accommodates 1,050 pupils ages 11-16. The new school enjoys Media and Visual Arts specialists' status.

The building houses learning, community and leisure facilities, which are accessed through a light filled multi-purpose central heart space. Dedicated teaching spaces sit either side of the three storey heart spaces. The 485 tonnes of structural steelwork by Caunton efficiently frames this two and three storey building of contemporary design, which itself achieves BREEAM 'Good'.

Thistley Hough High School was one of 18 secondary and specialist schools in Stoke on Trent to have new or refurbished buildings as part of the Building Schools for the Future (BSF) programme.

Balfour Beatty was the main contractor for this particular school.

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
